Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women, affiliated with Periyar University, adheres to the guidelines provided by the university for conducting internal assessments. These assessments play a crucial role in determining students' internal marks, which are considered collectively alongside other evaluation components. The college's Examination Cell oversees the centralized examination process, ensuring fairness and transparency in assessment procedures.

Internal theory examinations, including IAT-1, IAT-2, and model tests, are conducted at regular intervals, following the academic calendar. Prior notification is provided to students, allowing

them ample time to prepare for the assessments. Additionally, assignment topics are assigned to students, with clear instructions on submission deadlines. Faculty members support students' learning by facilitating reading materials and encouraging them to utilize both the physical and online resources available in the library.

During the challenging circumstances of the Covid-19 pandemic in the academic year 2020-21, the college adapted its assessment methods to comply with government regulations and ensure the safety of students and staff. With the postponement of university semester exams and practical schedules, internal assessment exams were conducted exclusively through online mode. This included the administration of model tests and e-quizzes, maintaining continuity in the evaluation process despite the disruptions caused by the pandemic.

Recognizing the importance of maintaining transparency in evaluation processes, the institution provides a platform for students to address grievances related to university examinations and internal evaluations.

Before examinations, common student grievances such as registration issues, subject discrepancies, and hall ticket generation errors are promptly communicated to the Controller of Examinations (COE) through the Exam Cell in charge. This ensures that administrative concerns are addressed in a timely manner, minimizing disruptions to the examination process.

The Exam Cell plays a crucial role in assisting students by providing timely updates regarding COE examinations through circulars, ensuring that students are well-informed and prepared for upcoming assessments.

During examinations, any grievances pertaining to question papers, such as out-of-syllabus questions or typing errors, are reported or clarified to the COE by subject faculty members through the Head of the Department (HOD) and Principal recommendation. This ensures that the integrity and fairness of the examination process are upheld, maintaining the credibility of the assessment system.

Students have the option to obtain photocopies of their answer scripts upon payment of a non-refundable fee as prescribed by the university. Subject experts evaluate these photocopies, and if deemed eligible for further evaluation, they are recommended to the COE. This process enables students to review their performance and seek clarification if needed, fostering a culture of accountability and continuous improvement in academic standards.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women, situated along the Salem-Bangalore National Highway (NH 47), boasts a sprawling campus spanning 10.61 acres. The institution is dedicated to

providing quality higher education for women and is well-equipped with a range of facilities to support this mission.

Classrooms form the backbone of academic activities, and the college prides itself on having 89 classrooms, all furnished with ICT facilities and Wi-Fi connectivity. Among these, 37 classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors, enhancing the learning experience with multimedia resources. The majority of classrooms, sized at 660 sq.ft each, accommodate up to 64 students, ensuring a comfortable and conducive environment for learning. Additionally, there are 7 smaller classrooms spanning 330 sq.ft each, with a seating capacity of 25 students, catering to more specialized sessions or smaller group activities.

Laboratories play a pivotal role in hands-on learning and research, and Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women boasts a total of 18 laboratories. These include 8 undergraduate laboratories, 6 postgraduate laboratories, 3 allied laboratories, and 1 language laboratory. In response to evolving educational needs, the institution continuously evaluates and upgrades its infrastructure. For instance, in 2020, a new undergraduate laboratory for Microbiology was added to enhance practical learning experiences for students.

4.1.2 - The Institution has adequate facilities for cultural activities, sports, games (indoor, outdoor), gymnasium, yoga centre etc.

Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women places a strong emphasis on holistic development, integrating sports and extracurricular activities as essential components of its curriculum. The institution boasts ample facilities to support these endeavors, providing students with opportunities to excel both academically and in various other pursuits.

A significant portion of the campus, measuring 21,638 sq.ft, is

dedicated to a playground, allowing for a variety of outdoor sports and activities. Additionally, the institution provides specific areas for sports equipment storage and maintenance, with a sports room spanning 1,320 sq.ft and a store room covering 660 sq.ft.

For outdoor games, the college offers five court/field facilities, including football, hockey, volleyball, KABADI, handball, and khokho. These facilities are meticulously maintained and adhere to standard dimensions, providing students with optimal playing conditions.

Licensed K7 Antivirus software is deployed across all systems to enhance security and protect against malware threats.

INFRASTRUCTURE AND LEARNING RESOURCES

4.1 - Physical Facilities

4.1.1 - The Institution has adequate infrastructure and physical facilities for teaching-learning. viz., classrooms, laboratories, computing equipment etc.

Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women, situated along the Salem-Bangalore National Highway (NH 47), boasts a sprawling campus spanning 10.61 acres. The institution is dedicated to providing quality higher education for women and is well-equipped with a range of facilities to support this mission.

Classrooms form the backbone of academic activities, and the college prides itself on having 89 classrooms, all furnished with ICT facilities and Wi-Fi connectivity. Among these, 37 classrooms are equipped with LCD projectors, enhancing the learning experience with multimedia resources. The majority of

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classrooms, sized at 660 sq.ft each, accommodate up to 64 students, ensuring a comfortable and conducive environment for learning. Additionally, there are 7 smaller classrooms spanning 330 sq.ft each, with a seating capacity of 25 students, catering to more specialized sessions or smaller group activities.

Laboratories play a pivotal role in hands-on learning and research, and Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women boasts a total of 18 laboratories. These include 8 undergraduate laboratories, 6 postgraduate laboratories, 3 allied laboratories, and 1 language laboratory. In response to evolving educational needs, the institution continuously evaluates and upgrades its infrastructure. For instance, in 2020, a new undergraduate laboratory for Microbiology was added to enhance practical learning experiences for students.

Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women places a strong emphasis on holistic development, integrating sports and extracurricular activities as essential components of its curriculum. The institution boasts ample facilities to support these endeavors, providing students with opportunities to excel both academically and in various other pursuits.

A significant portion of the campus, measuring 21,638 sq.ft, is dedicated to a playground, allowing for a variety of outdoor sports and activities. Additionally, the institution provides specific areas for sports equipment storage and maintenance, with a sports room spanning 1,320 sq.ft and a store room covering 660 sq.ft.

For outdoor games, the college offers five court/field

facilities, including football, hockey, volleyball, KABADI, handball, and kho-kho. These facilities are meticulously maintained and adhere to standard dimensions, providing students with optimal playing conditions.

Indoor games are also prioritized, with dedicated spaces for carrom, chess, table tennis, and shuttle badminton spanning 3,000 sq.ft. Furthermore, a well-equipped gymnasium covering 850 sq.ft is available to promote physical fitness among students.

To nurture students' cultural talents, the college features an open auditorium located in the Mother Teresa block, accommodating up to 1,000 spectators. The auditorium boasts a full-size stage, spanning 3,000 sq.ft, providing ample space for performances and events. During festivals and cultural gatherings, students showcase their talents both on and off stage, fostering a vibrant and creative atmosphere on campus.

To keep readers informed about current affairs, the library subscribes to eight newspapers and five magazines in both vernacular languages and English. These resources cater to a wide audience and contribute to a well-rounded reading experience.

The library's reading hall, equipped with seating for 100 individuals, provides a conducive environment for study and research. Furthermore, the digital library facility enhances accessibility to information through e-resources packages,

including circulation automation systems, gate registers, and OPAC systems. These digital resources offer convenience and efficiency in accessing and retrieving information, aligning with contemporary trends in library management.

4.3 - IT Infrastructure

Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women prioritizes providing robust IT facilities to its stakeholders, recognizing the increasing demand for internet access in education. The institution continuously upgrades its IT infrastructure to ensure it meets the evolving needs of the academic community.

The college offers 24/7 Wi-Fi access across its campus, ensuring that both students and staff members can seamlessly connect to the internet using their laptops after registering for access. This modernized internet connectivity facilitates various activities such as email communication, research, and accessing web-based applications necessary for assignments, projects, and seminars.

With 365 internet-connected computers and a dedicated server, the institution provides ample computing resources for its academic activities. Additionally, LAN facilities are available throughout the campus, facilitating interconnectivity among systems. The implementation of a 3-layer switching model ensures efficient data transmission, with a bandwidth of 50 Mbps, which is periodically increased, with 20 Mbps added during assessment periods to accommodate higher traffic.

To bolster cybersecurity measures, the college employs two firewalls to prevent unauthorized access to private networks.

Licensed K7 Antivirus software is deployed across all systems to enhance security and protect against malware threats.

Overall, Padmavani Arts and Science College for Women is committed to providing state-of-the-art IT facilities and

ensuring reliable internet connectivity to support the academic and professional endeavors of its stakeholders. Through continuous upgrades and adherence to security protocols, the institution strives to create a conducive digital environment for teaching, learning, and research.
